THE HISTORY

The National Day of Prayer is a vital part of our heritage. Since the first call to prayer in 1775, when the Continental Congress asked the colonies to pray for wisdom in forming a nation, the call to prayer has continued through our history.

THE VISION

To be a spiritual outreach communicating with families a need for personal repentance and prayer, and to mobilize them to personal and corporate prayer, particularly on behalf of the nation and those in leadership on all levels: government, church, education and media areas of influence.

To be a resource for Christian synergy in all of Indiana's ninety-two counties. To equip our state leaders for ministry and service to become more effective in sharing their faith in the public arena. To encourage the necessary link between personal faith and public life, we are calling on our leaders to rebuild our nation's foundation for liberty by embracing America's heritage.

HOW, YOU MIGHT ASK?

Provide a practical prayerful focus in churches, small groups, organizations and individuals as prayer missionaries to our state. Training church leaders how to establish and maintain effective prayer ministries.

Act as a conduit for what has been dubbed the "praying red cross" so we can respond to be salt and light in someone's hour of need anywhere in the state.

Support the over 300 coordinators across our state with training, encouragement and prayer so that they might hold larger or more impactful events of ecumenical Christian public prayer.

Visitation weekly to our Statehouse and the local offices our state leaders (ministers, education, judicial, family, media, government) offering confidential prayer support for them and their staff. To offer them resources that enhance their service to our Lord and our nation. To provide on site bible studies that are relevant and concise.

Provide a vigil of praying volunteers while the Statehouse is in session. Promote a daily

bible study conducted in the Statehouse chapel and in the larger offices for all interested government workers.

These studies are augmented by a series of special events like our Polity and Principal luncheons. These luncheons feature leading members of the legislator and public figures who share how a statesman's private faith impacts public service.
